Course descriptions and objectives: This course focuses on the constitutional and economic causes of the American Civil War as well as its tactical, strategic and technological components. Particular emphasis will be given to the war's long term social, political and psychological repercussions.

Attendance policies: Students whose number of absences is more than twice the number of class meetings per week (4 per semester) may be assigned a failing grade for the course at the discretion of the instructor. Students who have more absences than the number of class meetings per week but less than twice the number of class meetings per week (3 per semester), may be docked a letter grade for the class at the discretion of the instructor. Students who have absences which are less than or equal to the number of class meetings per week (1 or 2 per semester) will not be penalized.

The instructor endeavors to begin class punctually. If a student is not in his seat when the roll is called, or if a student leaves class early, the student will be recorded as tardy. Two tardies equals one absence. If you anticipate being late to class please notify the instructor beforehand.

Exams

There will be two examinations in this class. They are mandatory. No makeup exams will be given. Examinations are each 25% of your grade. Borderline or indeterminate grade will be adjusted according to class attendance and performance. All exams must be taken in class on the day designated in the schedule. If you have a documented emergency you may be allowed to drop the grade for a missed exam. You may exempt only 1 exam. There will be no make-ups for missed exams or quizzes. There will be no individual extra credit.

Papers

Each student will write two papers of 8 - 10 pages in length on assigned topics. The papers must be typed and turned in on the assigned date. N.B. for each day, or portion thereof, that a paper is late, regardless of the reason, the instructor will reduce the grade by 10 points. Citations must conform to the Turabian/ *Chicago Manual* guidelines or incur a 20 point penalty. These papers are each 25 % of the course grade.
