John Bell	Constitutional Union	Ambiguous: Adherence to “the Constitution, the Union, and the laws”	588,879	39
John C. Breckinridge	Democratic (southern wing)	Unequivocal: Federal government must actively protect slavery in the territories	849,781	72
Stephen A. Douglas	Democratic	Moderate/ambiguous: Douglas’s “Freeport Doctrine”: <i>Dred Scott</i> will be honored, but it does not require territorial governments to actively protect slavery	1,376,957	12
			<i>Losers’ totals:</i> 2,815,617	123
Abraham Lincoln	Republican	Unequivocal: <i>Dred Scott</i> was wrongly decided: neither the federal nor the territorial governments may permit slavery in the territories	1,866,452	180
